Sample Instructions for Voting Absentee

- (1) Mark only with a pen having BLACK INK.
- (2) To vote for a candidate whose name is printed on this ballot fill in the oval above the name of the candidate.
- (3) To vote for a person whose name is not printed on this ballot write or stamp his or her name in the space labeled "Write-In" that appears at the bottom of the candidate names for such office.
- (4) Any other mark or writing, or any erasure made on this ballot outside the voting ovals or blank spaces provided for voting will void this entire ballot.
- (5) Do not overvote. If you select a greater number of candidates than there are vacancies to be filled, your ballot will be void for that public office, party position or proposal.
- (6) If you tear, or deface, or wrongly mark this ballot, CALL the Board of Elections at (607-687-8261) for instructions on how to obtain a new ballot. Do not attempt to correct mistakes on the ballot by making erasures or cross-outs. Erasures or cross-outs may invalidate all or part of your ballot. Prior to submitting your ballot, if you make a mistake in completing the ballot or wish to change your ballot choices, you may obtain and complete a new ballot. You have a right to a replacement ballot upon return of the original ballot.
- (7) After completing your ballot, insert it into the OFFICIAL ENVELOPE provided, seal and sign.
- (8) Absentee Ballots returned by mail must be post marked no later than June 22, 2020, the day before Election Day and must be received by the Board of Election no later than 7 days after Election Day.

Sample Instructions for Voting at Your Poll Site

- (1) Mark only with a writing instrument provided by the Board of Elections.
- (2) To vote for a candidate whose name is printed on this ballot fill in the oval above the name of the candidate.
- (3) To vote for a person whose name is not printed on this ballot write or stamp his or her name in the space labeled "Write-In" that appears at the bottom of the candidate names for such office.
- (4) Any other mark or writing, or any erasure made on this ballot outside the voting ovals or blank spaces provided for voting will void this entire ballot.
- (5) Do not overvote. If you select a greater number of candidates than there are vacancies to be filled, your ballot will be void for that public office, party position or proposal.
- (6) If you tear, or deface, or wrongly mark this ballot, return it and obtain another. Do not attempt to correct mistakes on the ballot by making erasures or cross-outs. Erasures or cross-outs may invalidate all or part of your ballot. Prior to submitting your ballot, if you make a mistake in completing the ballot or wish to change your ballot choices, you may obtain and complete a new ballot. You have a right to a replacement ballot upon return of the original ballot.
- (7) After completing your ballot, insert it into the ballot scanner and wait for the notice that your ballot has been successfully scanned. If no such notice appears, seek the assistance of an election inspector.
